Hayward, Wis. (Special).--When the 50th renewal of the World's Log Rolling Championships is held at Hayward July 28-30, a record field of birlers from the United States and Canada will compete for men's title.

Although American cities have hosted all but one of the world's championships, the largest contingent from a state or province--ten in all, including the defending men's champion--will come from Nova Scotia.

The defending men's champion is Phillip Scott of Barrington, Nova Scotia, and he also won in 1968 and 1970. Two recent runners-up will be among the 32 men who will vie for honors. They are Jerry Phillips of Walla Walla, Wash. (1971) and Jim Ogle of Marquette, Mich. (1970). No American has won the men's title since 1954.

The defending women's champion is Phoebe Morgan, a 15-year old student from Hayward, and eight girls and women will vie for the 1972 title. Included will be Penni McCall, 17, from Lewiston, Idaho, who finishe d second in 1971 in a classic finals match to Miss Morgan.

Competition will also be held in trick & fancy and oldtimers log rolling among the professionals, and in amateur log rolling and trick and fancy for boys and girls. The growing popularity of log rolling among professionals and amateurs has prompted the scheduling of morning competition on each of the three days, starting at 9:00 A. M. Altogether, 64 birlers have entered the competition.
